Recently the library was able to talk with City Council about the many happening that took place this past year. Wow! Boy, did we have a big year. Check out a few of the wonderful things that happened at *your* local library this past year.

- ♦ 325 free tax refunds prepared
  - = \$350K in tax refunds to locals
- → 45,000 items checked out
  - = \$700K in dollars saved by patrons
- ▶ 8 weeks of Museum on Main Street
  - = \$400K Smithsonian exhibit value
  - 1500 students toured our library this year
- 4-month main level renovation complete

# Book Chat's 'Book of the Month'


"Book Chat" is a book discussion group that meets at the library the third Wednesday of each month at 10:30 a.m.
