



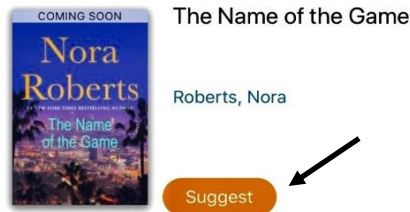
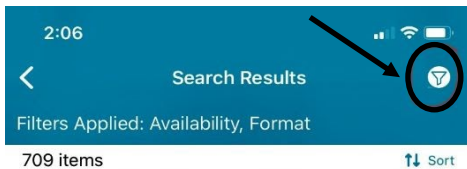

## What's Happening @ Your Library?

### Make an eBook suggestion...via Cloud Library

#### Did you know?

Patrons may suggest an eBook or audio title through the library's app called Cloud Library. To request that an eBook be added to our virtual collection simply tap the filter icon on the upper right hand corner and select "Suggestions for Library" under availability. Once selected, patrons will see all the titles related to their search not currently in our system, it is on this screen patrons may "suggest" an eBook be added to the library's collections.



#### Don't have the Library Cloud app on your device?

No problem! It's easy to download the Cloud Library app onto your device. Start by connecting your device to Wi-Fi and then go to your Apple App Store, Google Play or online at [yourcloudlibrary.com](http://yourcloudlibrary.com). Once the Library Cloud app is downloaded select **Illinois Heartland Library System**, enter your library bar code and your 4-digit pin (hint: your pin is the last 4 digits of your phone number)

#### How do I request an eBook through Cloud Library?



There are several ways to search the Cloud Library. Start your search by clicking the magnifying glass icon on the bottom of the screen and then select one of the following headings:

- \***Featured:** recommended
- \***Favorites:** by category
- \***All:** all materials
- \***Search tab:** keyword search

Once you find an eBook, tap or click on the book cover and choose the "borrow" or "save for later" button. Titles with a headphones on the book cover indicate they are audio books,

all other titles are eBooks. Audio books may be listened to by using headphones, speakers or through any Bluetooth device.

#### What if I want to request a paper book instead of an eBook/audio book?

Sometimes holding a book in your hand has no replacement—we understand! If you are searching for a book from our online catalog or while in the library and can't seem to find the title you are looking for please call, email, Facebook message us or tell us in person. Chances are that if we don't have the book you want there is someone else looking for it too—we welcome your input!

## Make-and-Take Kits Relieve Boredom for Pre-K thru Teen

Due to Covid-19, library programming looks a little different. 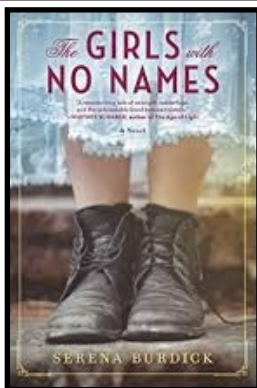

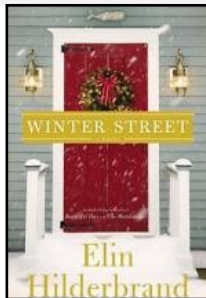
